Please note the items collected on Friday will be secured and shred by trucks during Saturday's collection.

Madison County Community Expo, at the London Elementary School on Elm St. (Sr.38)

Package your documents in manageable cardboard boxes or paper sacks.

Items which can not be accepted:

- Plastic of any kind.
- Binders or hard bound books.
- Any metal products.
- (staples & paper clips are ok)
